To apply for the notation, students submit an academic integration statement (~2000 words) responding to the following prompt:

Please describe your Cardinal Service experience, and discuss how this experience:

- 1. Contributed to your intellectual and civic development;
- 2. Provided opportunities to apply academic knowledge and skills to important public issues; and
- 3. Reflected a commitment to Stanford Principles for Ethical and Effective Service.
